## CASA Kane County CASA/GAL Job Description

The CASA/GAL (Court Appointed Special Advocate/ Guardian *ad litem*) is a trained volunteer whose role is to advocate for the best interests of abused and neglected children in the Juvenile Court system, serving as the child's appointed Guardian Ad Litem.

## The CASA Volunteer:

- Demonstrates emotional maturity
- Is objective and flexible
- Exhibits self-assurance and assertiveness
- Has the ability to make decisions and set goals
- Willing to commit to the program for a minimum of 3 years (avg. 5-10 hrs per month)
- Demonstrates the ability to write and speak clearly and concisely
- Demonstrates an intermediate level of technical skill for navigating emails, reports written electronically and note entry in database.

## **Qualifications:**

- Age 21 or older
- Complete pre-screening requirements online OR
- Attend a General Information Meeting (On-Line or In Person)
- Completion of CASA application, reference checks and fingerprinting
- Participation in the Pre-Service interview
- Successful completion of the CASA 45-50 hour Pre Service training

## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Accept assignment of the case as agreed upon between the volunteer and Supervisor
- Read and review all relevant records pertaining to the case
- Meet with Advocate to plan case strategy
- Interview all people and the child(ren) for facts to report
- Follow up on parent's services and include information in report to the court
- Maintain complete written records of the case in the Optima database
- Visit with the child/children <u>at least once</u> month
- Maintain all case information in strict confidence
- Monitor and facilitate case progress through the court system
- Prepare written report for the court in timely manner with approval from your supervisor
- Maintain good communication, contact and progress with your Advocate Supervisor and CASA/GAL Attorney
- Attend all court hearings and assure that the best interests of the child/children are being represented
- Attain a minimum of 12 Continuing Education credits annually (CASA provided)
- Accept, adhere to and support philosophies and policies of CASA Kane County
