Children can be placed in a foster home located anywhere in the state of Illinois. That placement can be a family member, a friend of the family, or a traditional foster home. CASA/GAL Volunteers visit the child or children on their case monthly, no matter where they are placed.



#### Are more likely to:


- Spend less time in foster care

## Before You Accept a Case



- Complete 8-week training course
- Receive your background clearance
- Become a Mandated Reporter
- Be sworn in by the Judge



# Training Expectations



• Complete a 45-hour training program on topics including:

Court Process Communication Skills Trauma & Resilience

Child Development CASA/GAL Role Cultural Competency

Clind Development Cristly Of IL Role Cultural Competency

Report Writing Optima Database Abuse & Neglect Factors

- Have a beginner level of computer literacy and access
- Complete 1-3 hours of homework before each session
- Attend one morning session of court as a CASA/GAL Observer
- Ask questions and advocate for your learning!

## FAQ's



- What happens if I have a vacation planned during the training session?
  - \* You can take a make up session up to 2 times during the training. If you are going to miss more than 2 classes, we ask that you pause and come back during a future training program where you can complete each.
- How many children do I advocate for at one time?
  - One case does not equal one child. Some cases have sibling groups.
- I know there is a 3-year commitment, but how long does it take to close a case?
  - \* Each case is different. We ask for a 3-year commitment to provide as much consistency as possible for the children in care.
- How much time does it take to volunteer each month?
  - \* Typically, about 5-10 hours, depending on the complexity of the case.

## FAQ's, cont'd



- Do I schedule the child visits or are they arranged for me? What about other meetings I will need to attend?
  - \* You schedule child visits according to your schedule and that of the foster parent. Other meetings may be scheduled for you, such as IEP meetings or court hearings, but you typically have plenty of notice to plan to attend and most are virtual.
- What happens if I can't attend a court hearing or do a child visit?
  - \* Each volunteer is assigned to an Advocate Supervisor who will support them throughout the life of their case. This includes providing coverage at meetings, hearings, child visits, etc., when the volunteer is unable to attend.
- Can I stay involved with a child once my case closes?
  - \* Yes, if that is something the parent/guardian and the children would like.
